What: Several inexpensive exercise aids for in-home circuit training.

How much: Six items add up to \$125; but you can buy one or all of them.

- Beaded jump rope, \$15, for cardio

COPPER SOCKS by Aetrex

What: Germ-killing socks made from copper fiber

How much: \$10 to \$25

Why buy it: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency this year allowed manufacturers to make the claim that copper and copper alloys used in clothing and can kill germs. So Aetrex started using copper fiber to make socks. The claim says put on a pair of copper socks and 99.9 percent of the germs on your feet will be dead in two hours.

What: Wristband with steel tag that can be engraved with contact information for medical emergencies.

How much: \$19.99

Why buy it: It's perfect for runners, walkers, rollerbladers, cyclists and swimmers who don't like to carry stuff while doing their thing. Plus, an interactive version of the wristband (which costs an additional \$9.99 a year) allows you to create an online emergency response profile that's available to first responders via telephone and the Internet. The wristband has reflective stripes to enhance your visibility in the dark and comes in your choice of six colors.

PLANET BIKE BLINKY 7 REAR BIKE LIGHT

What: Seven ultra-bright LED lights point in five directions for 220 degrees of visibility.

How much: \$16

Where to buy: REI in Brentwood and Velocity Cyclery, 286 DeBaliviere in Central West End

Why buy it: It'd be nice if we could all get our outdoor cardio workouts in during daylight when we're most visible to motorists. But as any avid cyclist, walker and runner will tell you, schedules don't always permit this. Thankfully, this ultra-light, weatherproof Blinky 7 light can be seen up to a mile a way and can be mounted on your bike or strapped to your arm.
